

Construction of new lifeboat station will be delayed to safeguard shorebirds

CONSTRUCTION work on a proposed new lifeboat station will be delayed to safeguard overwintering shorebirds.

Although the £3million project is



scheduled to start in April next year, piling will be postponed until May 1 by which time the Knot, Dunlin, Curlew, Sanderling and other species should have flown north to their breeding grounds.

The delay has been agreed following discussions between the RNLI, Natural England and North East Lincolnshire Council.

Works will then be put on hold again after August 31 when the birds will be returning.

A downside is that there is likely to be displacement for migrating Common and Sandwich Terns which often rest on this part of the beach during early August.

The new station, to be built on the beach, will replace the existing one, which is on a public highway, and will have its own slipway for launch and recovery of the lifeboat.

Target date for completion is mid-2023.

Well, if you had joined Grimsby RSPB Local Group zoom talks over the last year all this would be old hat to you!



Humberside Police appoint full-time wildlife crime officer

Pc Lawrence Grant (pictured) has taken over as the Wildlife, Rural and Heritage Crime Officer for the South Bank of the Humber - including the Cleethorpes, Grimsby and Immingham areas. He succeeds PC Jane Proud who has retired. Says Pc Grant: "My mother's parents were farmers in the area but my grandfather had retired by the time I was born. "He still retained some land around the farm house and I enjoyed tending it with him, digging out ditches etc."

"As a child I loved being outdoors and completed my Gold Duke of Edinburgh Award while at college.

"My passion for addressing rural and wildlife crime developed while I was working in Barton and subsequently Brigg. "I felt that rural communities often got overlooked due to most of our demand coming from urban communities."



Pc Grant became a police officer in 2016. He recalls: "I worked in Grimsby on Incident Response and Prisoner Processing, then Incident Response at Barton Police Station, before moving to a neighbourhood police officer role at Brigg. "Having worked in so many varied roles I have a good understanding of how investigations progress. This allows me to effectively investigate crimes, knowing each previous and subsequent steps in an investigation.


"Seasonal issues such as hare coursing continue to be reported frequently in autumn during and after harvest when the fields are reduced to stubble. This brings with it damage to newly seeded drill crops and gateways. "As a wildlife crime officer, I have received specialist training to investigate wildlife crimes such a badger baiting, hare coursing and poaching. I carry out this role full-time.

"What I cannot say often enough is that the public should report any and all crime no matter how small.

BOOK REVIEW: THE SOARING LIFE OF THE LARK



SMALL is beautiful. That seems to be the message from Doubleday Books with their pre-Christmas publication of nature writer John Lewis-Stempel's charming new book - *The Soaring Life of The Lark.*

It consists of fewer than 100 A5 pages of his own reflections, plus black-and-white sketches and poetry from yesteryear.

Had it not been for the fact that it is published in hardback, it could almost be classified as a pamphlet rather than a book. But those caveats aside, it is very pleasingly produced, and, costing only £9.95, represents good value in these inflationary times.

In his whistlestop tour of larkland, the author explores how this declining bird of open spaces has inspired poets from Wordworth to Shelley (his own favourite being George

Meredith) and composers such as Vaughan Williams whose famous The Lark Ascending was apparently written as he walked the clifftop outside Margate in Kent in the first week of the 1914-18 war. Borrowing from one of his earlier books, Where Poppies Blow, the author also describes how, in the same war, seemingly endlessly cheerful skylarks lifted the spirits of suffering soldiers in the trenches of the Western Front.

He laments both how larks were once exploited in their thousands by the caged birds trade and the ongoing decrease in their population in Europe as the result of modern intensive agricultural methods. Despite concerns about the future of skylarks, Lewis-Stempel strikes a refreshingly positive tone throughout his reflections. "Maybe it is the fancy of frail humans to believe the birds sing for us," he writes. "But listen to the skylark's song - surely it is Nature's own music."

SEAWATCHING - THE FOULER THE WEATHER, THE BETTER THE BIRDING

A SPIRITED defence of seawatching has been sounded by a leading ornithologist in the United States.


Contrary to Bill Oddie's description of it as "the most tedious of all pursuits", Christopher W. Leahy says there is "no greater pleasure (with a couple of exceptions) than to repose near the coast in the teeth of a cyclone watching masses of blurry avian forms passing through foggy oculars".

On his side of the word, the challenge is to keep "a sharp look-out for the Long-tailed Jaeger or Bridled Tern that is bound to show up if you stick it out a little longer".

He notes: "On a promising seawatching day, the weather is likely to be spectacularly foul - gale force winds howling and sheets of sleet streaming directly into your face and telescope.

"The bad weather has the effect of pushing bird species that normally shun the sight of land (e.g. shearwaters and phalaropes) into viewing range.

Leahy (author, incidentally, of *The Birds of Mongolia*) describes the "propensity to seawatch as a reliable genetic marker that divides the birding community".



He acknowledges that another downside is that it is "relatively stationary", but insists that every birder, even if "born

seawatch-negative" should "endure" the experience at least once.

* Leahy's comments come in his entertaining and informative new book, *Birdpedia - A Brief Compendium of Avian Lore* (Princeton University Press, £9.99) in which he covers some 200 topics, ranging from the latest insights on migration to how the approach of British birders diverges from that of their counterparts in the US where 54 per cent are women.




