Vine House Farm Visit – Saturday 10th May 2025

On Saturday 10th May 2025, ten club members met at Vine House Farm, Deeping St. Nicholas, at 8 a.m. to be shown around by Nicholas Watts. The day was bright, warm, and sunny.

Nicholas began by showing us a survey he had already carried out that morning along some of the ditches on his farm, something he does most days, covering 2–3 miles. We then set off in three cars, driving a few miles to a different part of the farm, where Nicholas showed us a couple of hedges he had planted, with ponds dug nearby and cowslips interplanted in between. Alongside one of the hedges were nest boxes for Tree Sparrows. Nicholas explained how having two hedges greatly increases biodiversity compared to just one, with the ponds further enhancing habitat variety. Additional seed and fat are provided for the birds, with the fat offering essential moisture, as chicks require “wet” food. The hedges were full of caterpillars, providing further food for birds.

There was also a brick tower that had been built for Barn Owls to nest in, though it is also used by other species. Species seen in this area included Barn Owl, Tree Sparrow, a distant Corn Bunting, and Starling.

We drove a little further to a site with some large Horse Chestnut trees. As we pulled up, we disturbed a pair of Red Kites. Nicholas explained how he also tries to encourage his neighbours to farm in more wildlife-friendly ways, and he showed us where one had begun planting new hedges.

Next, we visited a large heap of excavated sand, which was home to a sizeable colony of Sand Martins.

Further on, we came to a wetland habitat with several ponds and grazing cattle. Species seen here included Mute Swan, Egyptian Goose, Cuckoo, Oystercatcher, Little Egret, and Lapwing. Opposite was a large field where

sunflowers had just been sown—around 500 acres of the farm are used to grow bird seed, including black sunflower, red and white millet, canary seed, and oilseed rape.

We then stopped at a large dyke. Nicholas explained how he had persuaded the Water Board to stop cutting both banks annually and instead cut them in alternate years. This change allows species to shelter and nest on the uncut bank. Species seen here included Sedge Warbler, Reed Warbler, and Cetti's Warbler.

After that, we returned to the road and, after a brief stop opposite Baston Fen, continued on to the reservoir. Following an especially dry summer, Nicholas had the reservoir built, where he has encouraged Terns to breed. Unfortunately, none were seen during our visit, but we did see Black-headed Gull, Whooper Swan, Lesser Black-backed Gull, and Hobby. On the path to the reservoir, both Garden Warbler and Chiffchaff were in evidence.

By midday, we returned to the Farm Shop to wet our whistles and enjoy a very nice, large brownie, as well as to stock up on quality bird food. The café has a pleasant outdoor seating area overlooking some ponds and grassland. Here, we added Barn Swallow to our list.

By the end of the day, 52 species had been seen or heard. The Farm Shop and Café is a lovely place to visit and a great way to support a business that is actively supporting our wildlife.

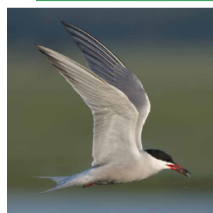

Around 65 coastal and inland sites recorded this species Apr-Oct. The first bird was at Boston GP Apr 17th, the same date as in 2022, with more arriving to the end of the month. Highest counts were: 86 Boston GP and 20 Kirkby GP, both Apr 27th. More followed in May as passage continued and breeding colonies were re-established. The following confirmed breeding records were received: Boston GP 15 young fledged by Jul 11th; Deeping Lakes 1807 5-6 pairs nesting Jul 8th; Frangipie Marsh 39 occupied nests with many pairs with chicks; noted Jun 16th; Freiston lagoon 53 apparently occupied nests; Kirkby GP 230 pairs initially failing to just as and a minimum of 2 broods of one and three chicks; Wherry NP two pairs nested with two fledged chicks noted Aug 20th onwards. Post-breeding flocks gathered during Jul with passage birds appearing on the coast from late Jul, with 122 Boston GP 26th, 110 Gibraltar Point Jul 31st and 65 Ardsley Jul 27th. Then numbers built rapidly on the Wash into Aug with 1,771 at Gibraltar Point Aug 13th and nine counts of 1,000 or more there, peaking at 5,000 Aug 26th, and 1,700 Wardwell Range Aug 15th. Other notable coastal counts are listed in the table. Numbers dwindled rapidly into Sep with 713 Gibraltar Point Sep 1st, 500 Sep 11th and 268 Sep 13th the most, and other notable counts at Ardsley, Cherborough, Sutton on Sea, and Wardwell. There were no records from any of the freshwater inland sites in Sep. In Oct, counts of 32 Gibraltar Point Oct 8th and 19 Oct 10th were the highest with 2 beginning thereafter and the last of the year were two there Nov 14. In addition, Gibraltar Point logged 1,290 'Common Terns' Aug 13th, and a total of 3,453 Aug 1st-26th.

Arctic Tern *Sterna parasidis*

Fairly common passage migrant, mainly coastal but there is a regular inland passage in spring. Has bred. Amber List. Threshold for international importance: 20,000; for national importance: no data.

The table lists the main sites recording this species; overall, more than 200 records were received from around 23 sites, seven of them inland (Boston & Langthorpe, Cowthorpe, Deeping Lakes, Kirkby GP, Messingham, Tattershall GP and Tott Newton Reservoir). The first of the year was at Cowthorpe Reservoir, Apr 15th with 15 there by Apr 23rd, followed by peaks of 60 Apr 17th and 150 Apr 26th at Gibraltar Point. The other freshwater bodies saw 1-5 birds through during the month. Smaller numbers were seen in May-Jun with 27 at Cowthorpe Reservoir Jun 1st and 1 at Deeping Lakes. Inland migration picked up from mid Jul, largely at coastal sites, peaking with 73 at Gibraltar Point Jul 27th. Numbers petered out during the first half of Aug-Sep but with some late peaks in Oct including six double-figure counts at Gibraltar Point, maximum 71 on 23rd. The last of the year saw some stragglers on the coast into Nov, the last at Gibraltar Point Nov 20th.

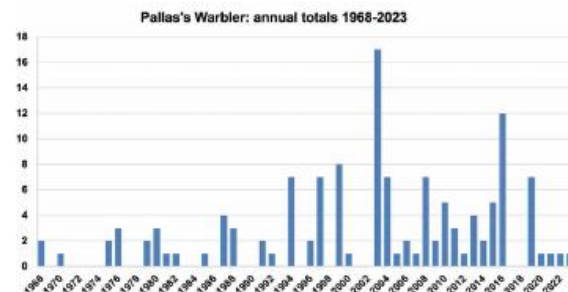

Rare, Siberia. **LBRC.**

One was found at the southern end of Anderby marsh Oct 8th and relocated at Wolla Bank Pt Oct 9th; it showed well for a small group of observers (RL, et al). This was the 16th county record, with the first modern record in Oct 1988, a second Oct 1990, and then 12 during the period 2000-2023.

The East Halton Buff-breasted Sandpiper by Graham Catley

Today I was privileged to witness something that I had never seen before and realistically never expected to see, the breeding display of a Buff-breasted Sandpiper. With a highly restricted breeding range encompassing only the High Arctic of northernmost Alaska and Canada, where access is at best difficult and very expensive and birds are thinly spread, the chances of seeing the lek of this species is for most people a remote possibility.

Buff-breasts are the only North American wader that leks with males gathering fairly close together to display to females but like Ruffs and other lecking species the males take no further part in rearing the brood. Males display in prominent raised areas in the high Arctic environment, usually along ridges, bluffs, and banks near creeks and rivers. Here, water sedge, dwarf willow, horsetail, mountain-avens, and cotton grass are common plants.

Similarly, females build the nest on dry slopes or other raised locations, often not far from a stream. Other occupants of upland tundra habitat include Baird's Sandpipers and American Golden-Plovers, and these three species are often found together during migration as well. They seek out mostly dry, flat habitats including sod farms, prairies, and many kinds of agricultural fields, so long as they are not covered by water or heavy vegetation.



As soon as they arrive on tundra nesting grounds, male Buff-breasted Sandpipers begin their rousing courtship displays. Several males (rarely up to 20) form a loose group (all within sight of each other) known as an "exploded lek," often on dry patches of tundra near river bends. These leks last for several days. Some males frequent the same lek location, whereas others move from lek to lek, taking short flights or in some cases wandering for hundreds of miles. Their displays are unusual among shorebirds, involving at least 17 different postures and behaviours. Most often, males crouch and raise the tail and one wing, waving the wing slowly to show the bright white under surface. They also leap into the air and flutter the wings in a balletic display. When a male has attracted the attention of a female, he raises and opens both wings, raises the bill and head, puffs out the breast, stands on tip-toe, and moves forward like a wind-up toy, making the wings move up and down. A receptive female opens and raises the wings, then turns her back toward the male. Leks can seem chaotic in their activities, as males often seek to disrupt other males' displays when females are present. Some males even try to distract others by mimicking female behaviour, and it is common to see males attempt to mate with other males at leks. Male and female do not form a pair bond; the females select nest sites, build nests, and raise young without help from males. After the breeding season, Buff-breasted Sandpipers gather in flocks for migration, like

most shorebirds. They arrive on wintering grounds in flocks but soon begin to establish feeding territories there. Males often display on wintering grounds and sometimes during migration.



Buff-breasted Sandpiper populations once numbered in the hundreds of thousands to millions, but by the 1920s hunting, overgrazing, conversion of prairie to cropland, and other landscape changes had brought this species close to extinction. Their numbers increased slightly after shorebird hunting was banned in the early 20th century, but are thought to be declining again. Partners in Flight estimates the global breeding population at 56,000, rates the species a 14 out of 20 on the Continental Concern Score, and includes the species on its Yellow Watch List for species with declining populations. Habitat loss and energy development projects (including



oil/gas and wind power) threaten the sites these birds use for display, nesting, and migration. The effects of climate change in the Arctic, including both sea-level rise and habitat changes, are likely to render some current nesting areas unsuitable.

My first Buff-breasted Sandpiper was a juvenile twitched at Blithfield Reservoir on September 21st 1980 on return from an unforgettable week in Cornwall that started with my first juvenile Spotted Sandpiper at Draycote Water on the way down and then produced not



only self-found Semi-palmated Sandpiper and Aquatic Warbler but juvenile American Golden Plover, two Pectoral Sandpipers, two Wilson's Phalaropes and a Ring-necked Duck. In early September 1981 Andrew Grieve rang me from Blacktoft to say that a juvenile Buff-breasted Sandpiper had flown from Blacktoft across the Trent towards Alkborough Flats. My first ever visit to Alkborough Flats on September 3rd duly relocated the Buff-breast feeding on burnt stubble fields with 70 Ruff.

With several notable Transatlantic flights in the 70's and 80's the wisdom was that it was actually easier to see Buff-breasted Sandpiper in Britain than in most of the US. A total of five autumn juveniles and an August adult followed before my first self-found local patch bird, an adult, at Chowder Ness on July 30th 2007. With six more juveniles and three adults, two in August and one on May 24th 2009 at Alkborough Flats I had amassed a total of 18 birds of this charismatic species up to the end of 2024 including two juveniles together at Rimac in September 2011. I spent a few hours lying in the dried out mud frequented by the Alkborough Flats spring bird but it never showed any inclination to display to the Arctic bound Ringed Plovers nearby. In spite of several visits to Canada and trips to Arizona, Texas and California it was the autumn of 2016 before I saw Buff-breasted Sandpiper across the pond when a juvenile was feeding with four Pectoral Sandpipers on the Spit at Campbell River, Vancouver Island.

So back to May 15th 2025:

It was cold with a freezing NE wind and after a morning of fruitless scanning of the local Swift flock, still only about 100, and the 30 or so House Martins and 50 Swallows I decided to look for waders around Goxhill – East

Halton. A couple of Sanderling on Monday with one a superb summer male and the faint possibility of something different at Winter's Pond saw me sitting in the car having a leisurely lunch and avoiding getting out into the cold wind. Two Whimbrel flew past and northwards after failing to find any suitable mud. But eventually it had to be done and I donned appropriate winter gear and walked to look at the one remaining good-looking



pool on the mitigation area. Now this was either good or bad timing but initially it seemed like the latter. As I scanned, I could only see one Ringed Plover but unfavourably a pair of Avocets and two Lapwings on the pool two species that are usually aggressive to any other waders. Indeed, as I walked up one of the Lapwings started chasing a Little Ringed Plover around the pool then it flew at the lone Ringed Plover which flew up accompanied by the Buff-breasted Sandpiper that I had not picked up on the deck. Dam and double dam as it and the RP flew up, up and away over the hedge and out over the Humber – that was just bad timing and I was cursing the time spent eating lunch when I could have been looking at a Buff-breast. The obvious thing to do seemed to be to walk down to the Humber, where it was low tide, and hope they had landed somewhere out there but a quick scan revealed many hectares of wader less mud and just three Shelduck. I walked towards Killingholme Haven checking the seaweed and upper mudflats but to no avail so I wandered back towards the car then walked up towards the pool where to my surprise the Buff-breast was feeding right next to the fence. The Lapwing seemed to have settled down so I set about taking to pictures but the light was dull and grey and almost murky. There were three or four Little Ringed Plovers on the pool and the Buff-breast seemed to be associating loosely with them but what happened when it flew and landed next to one of the LRP's had me stunned. It suddenly started displaying towards one of the LRP's with legs stretched and wings raised and held open showing off the amazing patterning on the underwing feathers. I fired off several shots but it was a bit distant and the background was a mess. Having seen images of this display it was truly exciting to see it in the flesh so to speak. During the next hour twice when the Buff-breast flew and landed it performed the same wing raised display sometimes strutting towards its friend and sometimes almost running with raised wings. The pattern of the upperwing proved to be almost as striking as the underwing and the bird was clearly uttering a low call while displaying but in the strong wind it was hard to hear. I managed a few more shots of the display but frustratingly thought I had got some video but I had pressed the wrong button on the camera in my excitement.

So, has a Buff-breasted Sandpiper ever displayed to a Little Ringed Plover in the past? Who knows what a vagrant in the wrong part of the world will do but for me this was a brief but amazing first and truly memorable encounter with one of the World's best waders.

UPDATE: The bird remained until Monday, 19th May 2025, during which time it was regularly observed displaying to Little Ringed Plovers and Common Snipe. Towards the end of its stay, it was also seen lifting a single wing and performing a jumping display. On the 19th, it was last seen flying off at 20:34, disappearing as a speck over the Humber.



Ace birder Josh Forrester is newly-appointed Coastal Ranger for Cleethorpes

NOT many local councils can boast an expert birder on their staff, so hats off to North East Lincolnshire Council for appointing Josh Forrester to their team.

An experienced and highly-skilled ornithologist, Josh is the newly-appointed Coastal Ranger for Cleethorpes, and his responsibilities will include monitoring the birds and other wildlife that are a feature of most parts of the foreshore.

He will also be giving talks and leading guided tours - with two tours already having taken place in his first month in office.

A longstanding member of the Lincolnshire Bird Club, Josh has long been a patch birder in Grimsby - specifically, since 2015, at Scartho Cemetery/ Gooseman's Field where he has developed a happy knack of discovering unusual passage migrants such as Ring Ouzel, Brambling and, this spring, a singing Wood Warbler.

However, his most famous local discoveries have been a White-tailed Eagle (May 3, 2022) and an Alpine Swift (March 30, 2023) plus the Black-throated Thrush which attracted hundreds of twitchers from all over the country after he detected it in late-January, 2020, on the grassy campus at Grimsby Institute where he worked at the time.

Says Josh: "I see my role as one of engagement - to encourage people to appreciate this fabulous location.

"We want them to come here and enjoy it, but we feel that by also giving people some extra knowledge on what makes it so special, we can encourage them to have a greater respect for it."

In his new post, Josh will be part of the council's ecology unit.

Morocco May 2025 - Words and Images by Andrew Chick

Phil Espin, Andy Sims, and Andrew Chick, three long-time birding friends from Lincolnshire, set off on an ambitious adventure to Morocco in search of North African bird specialties.

The whole trip was organised by Phil, who took charge of contacting the guide and sorting out all the logistics. The goal was to track down several desert specialists and a number of newly split species.

Upon landing in Morocco, we were greeted by our guide, Hamid (from Moroccan Birding Trips), who quickly nicknamed Andy Sims, our most senior team member "The Chief," a title he proudly carried throughout the trip.

Phil and the Chief had birded Morocco some 25 years earlier, and this was a return trip for them...

Day 1

Phil and the Chief travelled to Gatwick the night before, booked into a hotel, and managed a short birding session around London. Travelling in relative comfort, they'd booked British Airways, while Andrew was roughing it with Ryanair from Manchester, his fate uncertain! Only on Ryanair do people clap on landing in Marrakesh!

A shaky start, our guide seemed unsure about the Marrakesh accommodation, but after some frantic WhatsApp messages, all was resolved and no tents were required. Our first night was spent at Hotel Palais al Bahia in Marrakesh.

However, to great dismay, there was no Wi-Fi. Dinner included a tuna salad starter and a beef tagine with prunes and egg.

Day 2

After breakfast at the hotel, we headed up into the Atlas Mountains towards Oukaimeden in Hamid's pristine black VW Transporter, his pride and joy.

The day's target was Crimson-winged Finch, and we saw plenty. Flocks of Chough and Alpine Chough were also present.

Lunch was another tagine in a small mountain café, followed by black coffee, though The Chief wasn't happy about his tiny portion and grumbled for hours.

We stayed at the scenic Hotel Maquis, featuring a pool and rooftop views. Andrew, missing his swimwear, took a dip in his underwear. We celebrated with Casablanca beers and a lemon chicken tagine.

Today was mostly spent covering 320 km across the High Atlas and into the Moroccan interior, eventually reaching Riad Bird in Boumalne Dades.

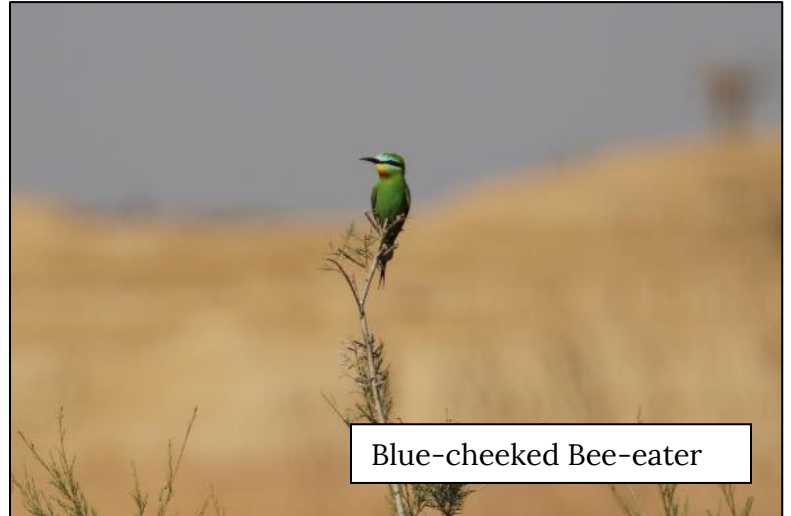
As we ventured inland, the heat intensified. We stopped regularly for birding and were rewarded with sightings of five Blue-cheeked Bee-eaters and a pair of smart Rufous Bush Robins.

Day 4

The morning started at a dump full of flies, dogs, and plastic, an unpleasant but productive birding spot.

We spent the rest of the morning on the Tagdilt Track searching for semi-arid specialists. The star bird was a roosting Pharaoh Eagle Owl with chicks, with Maghreb Wheatear and Thick-billed Lark as runner-ups.

Later, we wandered through agricultural fields near the Riad. Levillant's Green Woodpecker was heard repeatedly but finally seen, thanks to Hamid's determination.

Day 5

We visited the stunning Todra Gorge, a major tourist hub, trying to lure out Tristram's Warbler by playing recordings among the crowd, unsuccessfully.

Later, we went after the rare Sahara Scrub Warbler in strong wind and swirling sand. After an hour of trudging, we found it, our guide was relentless.

A failed coffee attempt at a 'solar-powered van' led to disappointment as the sun had gone in and the battery was dead.

Driving toward the Sahara, the familiar orange dunes rose in the distance. Phil and the Chief reminisced about earlier trips with the much-missed

Our desert hotel was right on the dunes. Hamid stopped to buy us some beers, wise move, as the hotel had no alcohol and we became the envy of the other guests.

Andrew lucked out with a palatial single room. The hotel had a Butlin's-in-the-desert vibe and, naturally, another chicken tagine.

Day 6

It was raining in the Sahara, unbelievable! Everyone warned us about heat, yet here we were, soaking wet.

Hamid had a day off, so his brother (or cousin, or uncle?) took over in a 4x4. Despite the weather, birding was phenomenal. We saw three Sandgrouse species and debated a possible fourth. Then came Desert Sparrow, an obliging African Desert Warblers, and then, sadly, The Chief's camera gave up.

The highlight, we met a nomad who guided us to an Egyptian Nightjar with chicks.

Andrew went for a walk and ended up caught in a thunderstorm. A camel-feed truck rescued him from an exposed field. Dinner was again in our Moroccan Butlin's.

We observed a lot of unchecked tourism on the dunes, motorbikes, quad bikes, and lots of plastic, sobering sights!

Day 7

Leaving the desert, we finally found a working mobile coffee van.

Phil had been dropping hints all trip about the elusive Tristram's Warbler. Hamid clearly got the message.

Shortly after leaving the dunes, we pulled over and climbed into a ravine full of junipers and rosemary. Despite strong wind, we located a Tristram's Warbler, Phil and the Chief were ecstatic. 25 years in the making!

Next, we visited the Forest de Smim, home to oak woodlands, and quickly picked up a striking male Atlas Flycatcher among other woodland birds.

We checked into Le Gite du Barrage. After a great fish dinner (no Tagine), we returned to the woods and eventually spotted a Maghreb Owl perched in an oak—its eyes glowing in the torchlight.

Day 8

A superb breakfast followed a cautious morning walk dodging wild dogs.

Our guide lovingly washed his precious VW. Back in the woods, we tried again for a daytime roosting owl with no success but added Honey Buzzard, Hawfinch, and more Atlas Flycatchers to the growing list..



We stopped at the “monkey woods” to meet some aggressive Barbary Apes, then had a long wait for lunch—chicken and tuna tacos.

Finally, we arrived at Ziada, the last stop, hoping to find Dupont's Lark. An evening search yielded nothing.

Dinner included a bottle of Moroccan red, The Chief declared it lacked body. A traditional Berber performance followed, which was best described as screechy. When they paused, we hoped that it was the end.

Day 9

A very early 6 AM return to Ziada Plain for a final attempt at Dupont's Lark. The sunrise brought lark song, but not the one we were after.

No sightings, just some compensation with a lovely Rufous-tailed Bush Robin.

We left just after 9:30 AM and drove back to Marrakesh, arriving by 5:30 PM. Phil scored a room with a balcony—finally, his turn for a room win.

Andrew briefly met up with Grahame Hopwood and Helen, who had birded a similar route but with a different guide, rather depressingly, they had successfully seen both Dupont's and Houbara Bustard. A little demoralising after all our efforts!

That night, Andy Sims came down with food poisoning, raising travel concerns, but a hefty dose of Imodium worked wonders!

Day 10

Phil and the Chief took their comfy BA flight home, leaving Andrew behind to wander Marrakesh until his late-night Ryanair flight.

All agreed it had been a successful trip. Phil and the Chief saw 8 lifers each; Andrew clocked up 23 new birds!

Hamid from @Morocco Birding Tours was top-notch, and we'd wholeheartedly recommend him.

We recorded 136 species overall, mostly desert and North African specialists, with few waders or gulls to bulk up the list.

Andy Sims made it home in one piece, to Phil's relief. Andrew arrived in Manchester at 23:50 and spent the early hours in Terminal 1's 24-hour Greggs with fellow stranded travelers, waiting for the 04:05 train home...

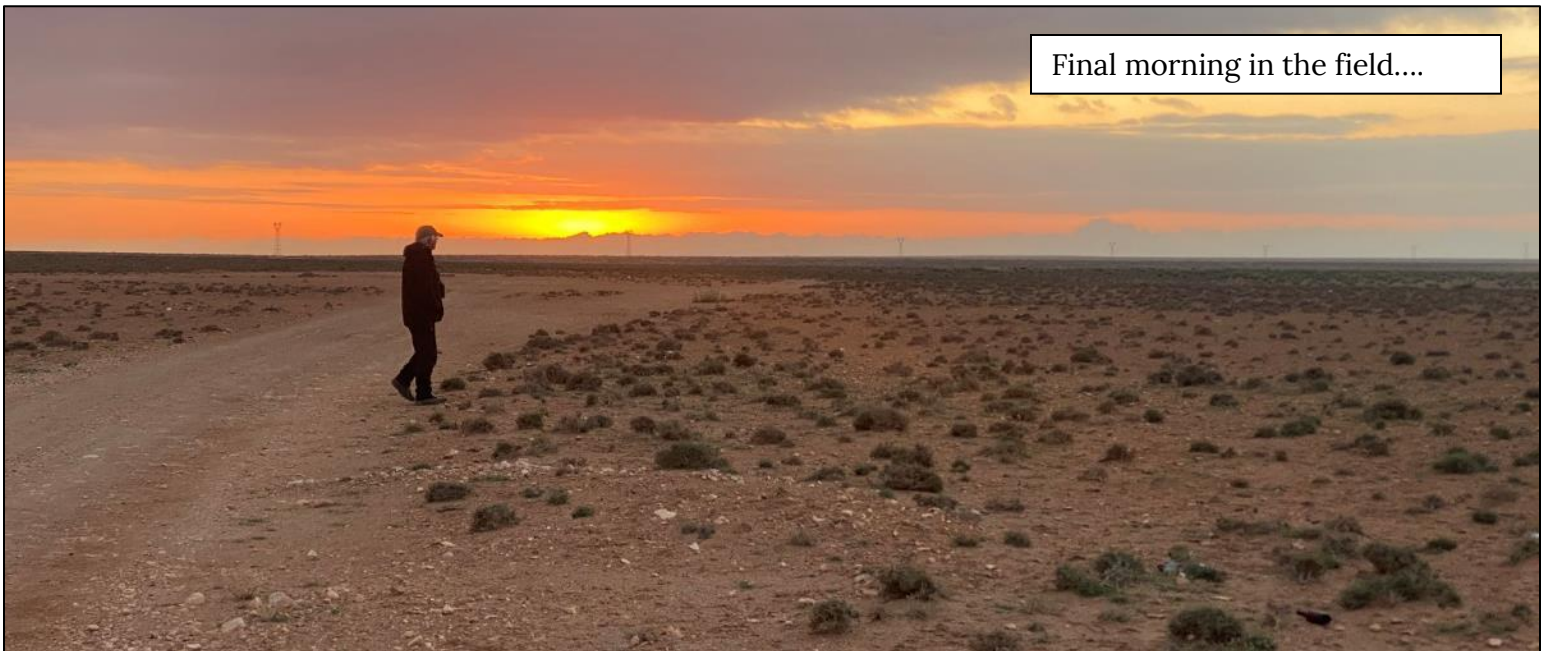

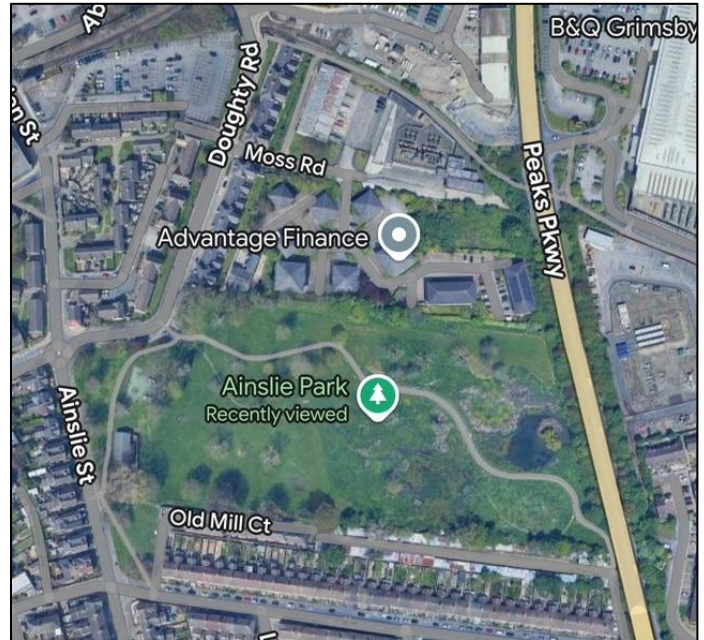


Ainslie Park, Grimsby: can you provide bird records please?

Phillip Porter of LNU has contacted us as follows:

Ainslie Park is a small urban park of 3.5 hectares extent near Grimsby town centre, owned by North East Lincolnshire Council, lying between Ainslie Street and the A16 Peake's Parkway just a couple of hundred yards south-east of the Town railway station, at grid reference TA271089. It is entirely isolated from other greenspace. In 2009, Google maps show it as a simple mowed greenspace dotted with mature parkland trees.

Since then, the park has gradually been transformed by the unexpected huge expansion of a tiny spring-head on the eastern boundary which has flooded up to half of the area in recent years, and caused a great rise in the water table that has killed many of the park trees. Apart from a shallow waterbody of about 250 square meters, there is an area of wet grassland and stands of reed and reed-mace and developing scrub. A hard footpath raised above flood level has made access straightforward as can be seen from the current Google satellite view below.



North-east Lincolnshire Council Ecology Team manages the site in conjunction with Grounds Maintenance and Flood and Drainage and is keen to maintain its new aspect, to create a biodiversity baseline, and establish appropriate management, with future management to include local volunteers.

Lincolnshire Naturalists Union (LNU) has offered to build up species lists to support this effort and its members have already made contributions featuring invertebrates, plants and fungi. However, there seem to be no bird sightings for the site in the Lincolnshire Bird Club (LBC) records. The potential of the site is limited by its size and urban isolation but LBC would be glad to receive records from any local people who might be able to fill half an hour by checking on the park through the seasons. All species records are welcome.

Casual observations by the above specialists have recorded singing reed warbler and Cetti's warbler, and owing to the location near the coast, more persistent coverage by locals might add some surprising additions to the expected common species.

If anyone already visits Ainslie Park perhaps you could create a Birdtrack/ebird site for it and submit records. Adhoc or regular would be welcome. Alternatively, please send your records direct to LNU at philporterent@outlook.com

Book review: *Birdland - A Journey Around Britain on The Wing* by Jon Gower

FORMER BBC documentary-maker Jon Gower saves the best almost until last with his latest book, *Birdland - A Journey Around Britain on The Wing*.

The chapter headed *Rarity Value* is effectively an extended interview with Lincolnshire Bird Club chairman Phil Espin with whom he went walkabout one October morning at Gibraltar Point.

The author describes Phil as "a twitcher on a global scale" which rather overlooks his other contributions to birding, not least his valuable research for the BTO, the RSPB and LBC.

Phil's journey apparently started aged four when he was fascinated by a Robin that pitched up while his father was digging for potatoes in the garden.

Since then, much of his life has been an incredible birding adventure, with one of the most memorable weekends being that of Whitsun, 1990, when he travelled the length and breadth of Britain to catch up with such magical species as Alpine Accentor, Pallas' Sandgrouse, Ancient Murrelet and Rustic Bunting.

On an earlier occasion, he was having his hair cut when message arrived that Yellow-breasted Bunting had been spotted at Gib.

You can guess what happened next. With his hair only half cut, he dashed off to see the rarity, a "fantastic" male bird in breeding plumage which was feeding on the ground.

The interview makes for absorbing reading as, in their unique ways, do the other 15 chapters.

Likely to be of particular interest to anyone who has been on LBC holidays to Scotland is the section on Kingussie, RSPB Insh Marshes, Abernethy and the Cairngorms.

The author's companion here is the RSPB's Jeremy Roberts whom he quizzes about the uncertain future for species such as Ptarmigan and Dotterel.

Back comes the reply: "Ptarmigan are incredibly confiding birds.

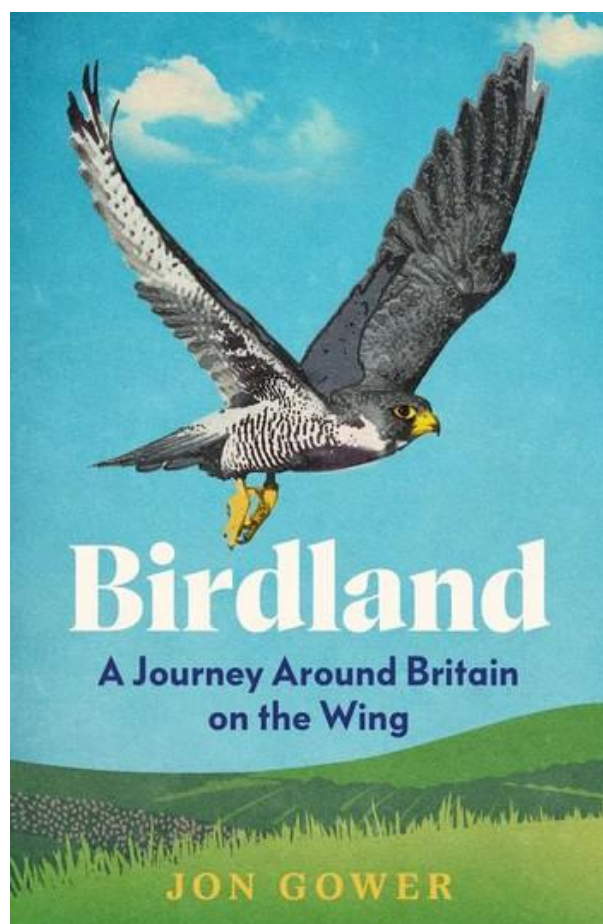
"You can be walking along and you realise that there's one trotting ten metres away from you.

"Dotterel are the same which is nice for those of us who go for for a walk and come upon them and watch them responsibly, but it's not great when somebody's got a dog off-lead and it gives chase."

Other chapters provide fascinating insights about, for instance Great Bustards on Salisbury Plain, Brent Geese on the Essex saltmarsh, Swifts in Oxford and Max Shearwaters on Bardsey.

Highly recommended, *Birdland* is published at £22 in hardback by Harper Collins.

Global Birdfair 2025

Among other species affected are Flesh-footed, Buller's, Sooty and Short-tailed Shearwaters, plus other subantarctic visitors to the region: Giant Petrels, Grey Petrels and smaller albatross species.

Global Birdfair projects are chosen carefully by us for their positive impact on species, habitats and people. We hope that Safeguarding Ocean Species addresses critical gaps in awareness and compliance as follows:

Species: Ensures the adoption of best-practice seabird bycatch mitigation measures on longline fishing vessels, directly reducing interactions with highly threatened species like the Antipodean Albatross.

Ocean Systems: Contributes to more sustainable fisheries and healthier marine ecosystems, creating resilience against climate change and improving the long-term sustainability of ocean resources.

Society: Strengthens local livelihoods by employing a local Port-based Outreach officer and coordinator, while empowering women through training and paid opportunities to produce tori lines for vessels.

The project is closely aligned with the Agreement on the Conservation of Albatrosses and Petrels (ACAP). Additionally, the project supports the 2050 Blue Pacific Strategy by advancing sustainable fisheries management and promoting biodiversity conservation as part of a broader vision for resilient Pacific ecosystems. Working together, we all need to address the critical state of the World's Oceans as habitats.

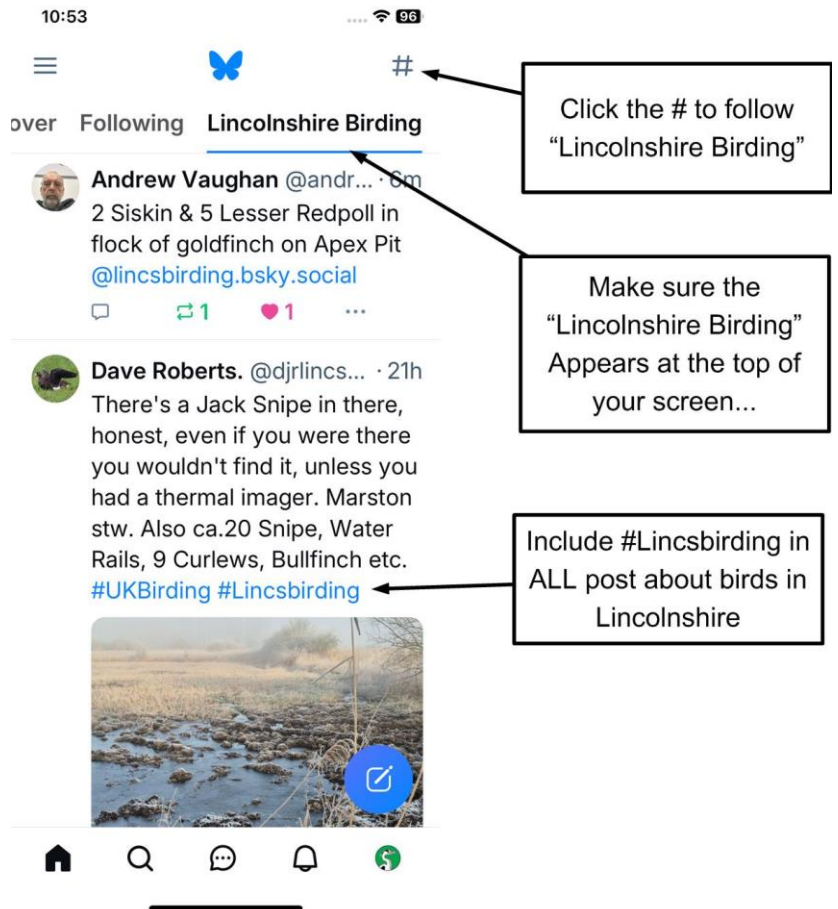

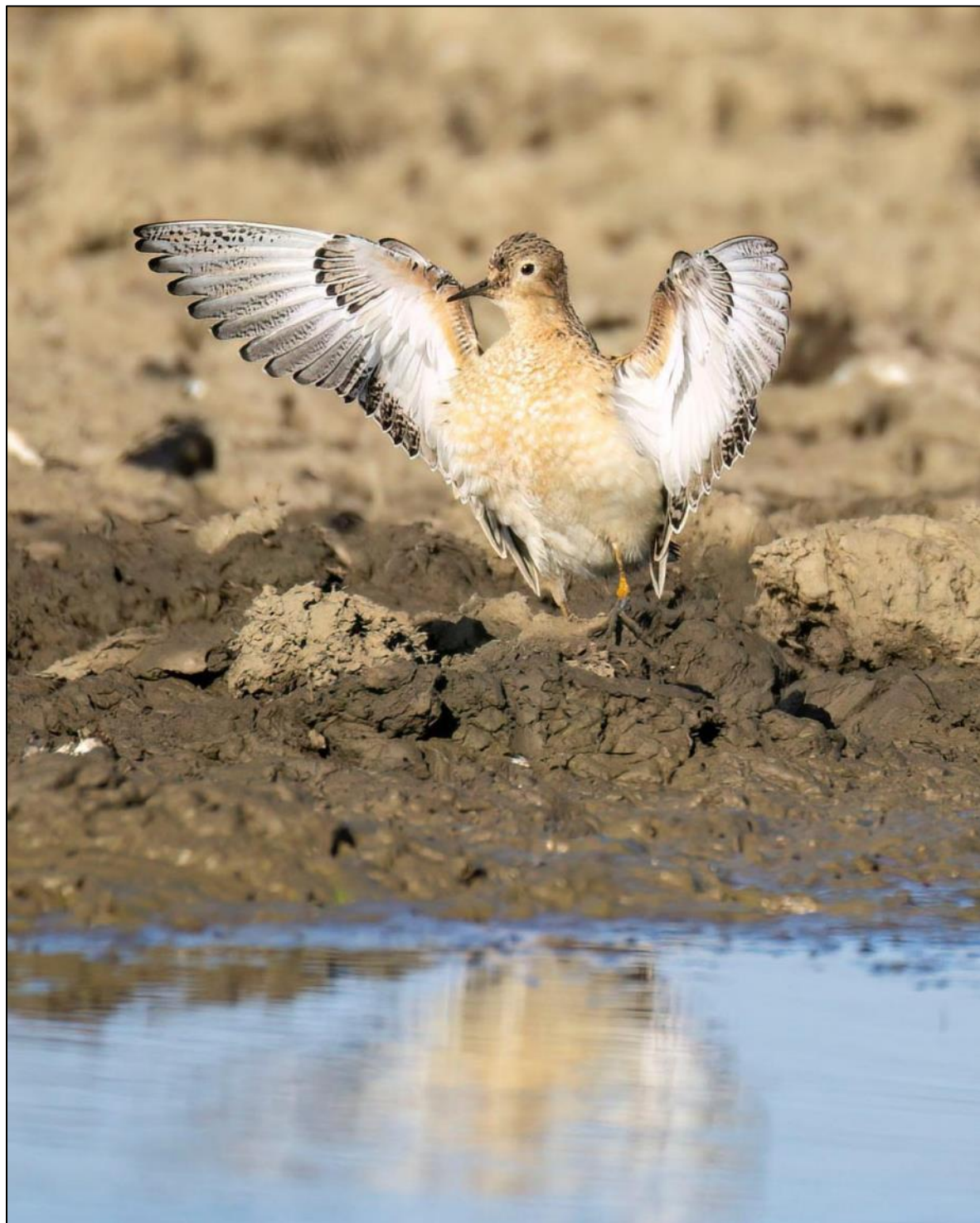
